SENIOR CHECKLIST

- 1) Recommendations: Some sort of resume is needed for recommendations and scholarships. The Resume / Recommendation Data Sheet should include information from experiences during grades 9 – 12, both in and out of school. Allow at least ONE WEEK for recommendations to be completed. It should be returned to your Counselor. This is especially important for scholarship applications and nominations.

- 2) Testing: Planning to attend a 4 year college? You need to register for AND take the ACT and/or SAT. Many two-year colleges in Georgia do not require these tests. If a college-bound student does not take one of these tests in the 1st semester of senior year, then he/she may jeopardize acceptance to a college.

If a junior or senior is eligible for free or reduced lunch, he/she is eligible for a fee waiver. In their entire high school career, each eligible student can receive 2 fee waivers for ACT, 2 fee waivers for SAT and 4 fee waivers for college applications. STUDENTS SHOULD USE THE QR CODE OR EMAIL THEIR COUNSELOR TO REQUEST A FEE WAIVER.

- 3) Gafutures.org should be used to find helpful resources for career exploration, college planning, financial aid and scholarships. Students should use their most current account. This is also necessary for your HOPE and FAFSA applications as well as transcript requests. www.Gafutures.org
- 4) College Campus Visits. Two absences are allowed with parental approval and prior approval by PCHS administration. Students should request and submit Campus Visitation request form to his/her counselor at least a week in advance. It must be approved by the principal.
- 5) College and Military representatives schedule regular visits during lunch period. Take advantage of the opportunity to meet with these representatives.
- 6) Apply to schools in the fall. It is best to apply on-line. Early decision is encouraged in the fall. CHECK DEADLINES! Request transcripts from counselor via www.gafutures.org or signing the request sheet in the main office. Mail transcripts, recommendation, etc. together. You may mail the transcripts with applications but KEEP IT IN SEALED ENVELOPE.
- 7) NCAA: Athletes should be registered with NCAA by the spring of their junior year at www.eligibilitycenter.org. Students eligible for fee waivers can have the registration fee waived. Request a fee waiver when setting up your NCAA account. Ms. Caldwell will process the request and upload your transcript. Updated transcripts are uploaded to NCAA after the end of each semester after transcripts are updated in Infinite Campus.
- 8) Transcripts: If you need to request a transcript to be sent to a college or for a scholarship program, you may submit your request by either 1) using your counselors' QR code 2) electronically via gafutures.org under the College Planning tab or 3) emailing your Counselor including the email address or mailing address where the transcript should be sent or 4) complete the Final transcript request during graduation week in May 2023.
- 9) Scholarships / Financial Aid resources (USE ONLY FREE RESOURCES):
 - Pay attention to announcements, your school email, REMIND and PCHS website for updated scholarship info.
 - Try google searches for topics that are unique for you such as career interest like pre-law, heritage, religion, hobbies, etc.

In addition to completing the FAFSA, students should also complete GSFAPPS for HOPE. Both can be done via gafutures.org. FAFSA Night is October 4, 2022 at 6:00 pm.

- 10) Voter Registration is required for the financial aid process. Students, especially males, that are 18 years old need to be registered to vote. 18-year-old males must do this for Selective Service. If you are not registered yet, community organizations will visit the school at various times during the year or online with the FAFSA.
- 11) Dual Enrollment: If you are interested in taking a college class next semester while you are in high school, please see your school counselor to discuss your options. The deadline to get all paperwork completed for spring semester is November 1st. Keep in mind that you must be on track for graduation to participate, and Dual Enrollment grades are placed on your high school and college transcript.

HOPE Program – Information found at www.gafutures.org

HOPE Scholarship Eligibility- students must have a 3.0 average in ALL core-curriculum coursework (Math, English, Science, Social Studies and Foreign Language). Students Graduating after May 1, 2016 must meet the additional rigor requirement and have four full academic credits from the approved academic rigor courses list that can be found at gafutures.org. Award amounts vary and can be better determined at gafutures.org. Zell Miller Scholarship requires a 3.7 GPA in all core-curriculum coursework and a score of at least 1200 combined reading and math scores on a single administration of SAT or an ACT composite score of at least 26. Students Graduating after May 1, 2016 must meet the additional rigor requirement and have four full academic credits from the approved courses list that can be found at gafutures.org. Award amounts vary and can be better determined at gafutures.org.

HOPE Grant & Zell Miller Grant- are for students working towards a certificate or diploma at a technical college. For Zell, full-time enrollment is not required and students are not required to graduate from high school with a specific GPA, however, a minimum 3.5 cumulative post secondary GPA, at the end of each term, is required in order to maintain eligibility. For HOPE, full-time enrollment is not required and students are not required to graduate from high school with a specific GPA, however, they are required to have a postsecondary cumulative 2.0 GPA, at certain checkpoints, in order to maintain eligibility.

How to Calculate 4.0 GPA: Use the following scale A= 4 points, B= 3 points, C= 2 points and F= 0 points

Add up all grades according to the given scale and divide by the total number of classes for the grade point average. Remember that for calculating the HOPE or Zell Miller GPA, calculate only core academic, CTAE and foreign language classes.

HONOR GRADUATE CALCULATIONS: Honor graduates are determined by calculating all courses with weighted/bonus points. The weighted point system is as follows:

- 5 points- AP classes
- 3 points- Gifted/Honors/Accelerated

Students with an overall GPA of 95 or higher earn the Honors Graduate with Distinction status at the end of the first semester of senior year. Students with an academic GPA of 90 - 94 earn the Honor Graduate status at the end of the first semester of senior year.

REMINDERS

October 4th - We will have a Senior Parent College Planning & Financial Aid Information night. This is an important meeting for seniors and their parents. Our representative from the Georgia Student Finance Commission GAfutures will make a presentation. Parents will receive info that explains federal and state aid. Your SAT/ACT scores must be sent directly from the College Board or ACT to the college of your choice. You can identify these schools when you sign up for the SAT (ACT will do the same). You may also do this by logging on the College Board website- click College Board Test, click SAT Scores, click Send and View Scores on the right. This includes NCAA & NAIA for student athletes- scores must be sent directly. Apply for early admission to college to hopefully avoid housing shortage often experienced on some campuses. Check your college website for early admission deadlines.

DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE TO BEGIN YOUR PROCESS FOR GRADUATION, MEET DEADLINES, DO APPLICATIONS, REQUEST INFO FROM YOUR COUNSELOR, TURN IN WORK, CHECK FOR ANY FEES OWED, ETC!
